

Clinical Psychology Supervisor – Academic B

School of Health, Medical and Applied Sciences

You will:

Oversee the day-to-day support for Master of Clinical Psychology students on placement at the Psychology Wellness Centre under the direction of the Director – Psychology Wellness Centre. You will have an understanding of the Master of Clinical Psychology curriculum, practical skills for psychological assessment and interventions, and competency requirements for psychologist registration.

You will work with the Director – Psychology Wellness Centre, and Clinical Supervisors, to support students to practice safely and to develop competencies for psychological practice. This includes providing corrective feedback when a student requires further development to meet a specific competency.

You will also support clinical learning by initiating and maintaining industry links and partnerships, facilitating effective clinical learning in practice-based education and contributing to quality outcomes through scholarly activities, research and/or relevant professional activities.

You are responsible for:

- Facilitating pre-clinic case meetings for students on placement.
- Supporting students with preparation for, and de-briefing after, client sessions.
- Assisting students with the scoring and interpretation of psychological assessments.
- Providing education, consultation and reflection on clinical practice for students.
- Checking student case-notes and communication to external stakeholders.
- Supporting students to identify and manage clinical risks and safety on the placement.
- Liaison with clients, referrers and industry partners as required to provide safe and effective services.
- A range of administrative functions relevant to the role, including triaging the client waitlist and updating clinical forms and processes as required.
- Attending school and/or division meetings and/or membership of a number of committees.
